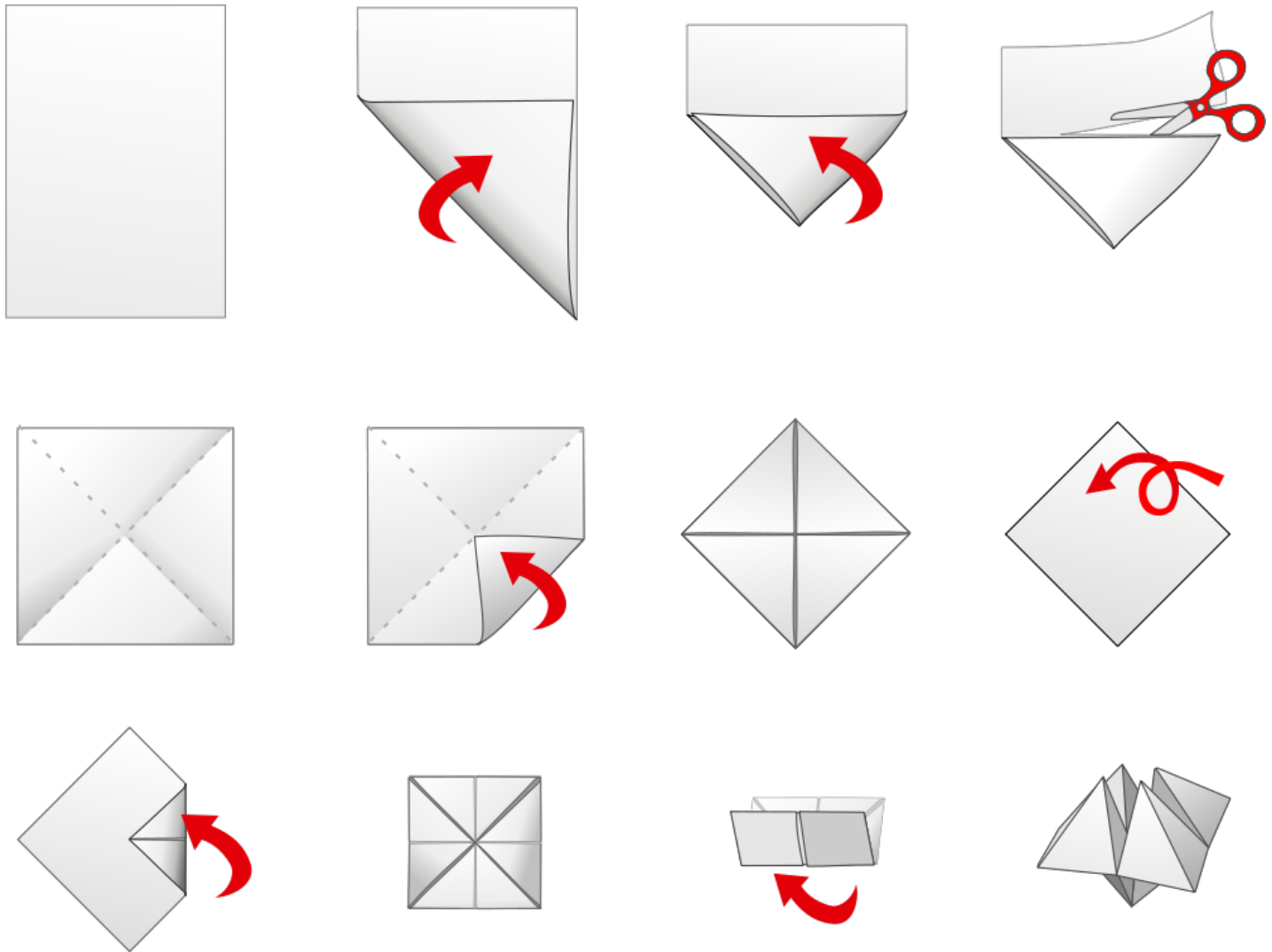




# Make a 5210 Fortune Teller!

A fun activity for an after-school program or youth center is making 5210 fortune tellers. Let youth brainstorm ways they can live out the 5210 message – all they will need is a piece of paper, scissors, markers, and creativity!

Here is how to fold a fortune teller:



Once the fortune teller is folded, mark each of the four outside faces with a 5, 2, 1, or 0. Mark each triangle of the inside flaps with a 5, 2, 1, or 0. On the underside of these flaps, write healthy behaviors that correspond with the numbers on the top sides of the flaps.
